

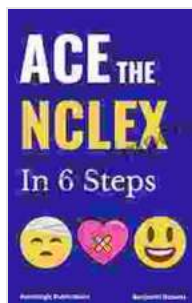
Ace the NCLEX in Steps: The Ultimate Guide to Passing the Nursing Exam

Each section is further divided into subcategories, and you will be asked a total of 75 to 145 questions. You will have up to six hours to complete the exam.

- Use a variety of study materials, such as textbooks, online resources, and practice exams.

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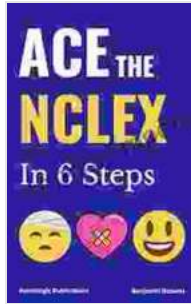
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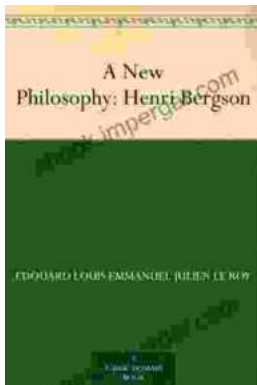
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
